IMPACT REPORT 2018

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Working with Year 12 state school students from low income backgrounds, the charity works to broaden access to business, with a focus on showcasing how commercial teams work seamlessly with their legal and finance colleagues to deliver business strategy.

It is the first and only programme in the UK that enables students to see all three key elements of business in this way. In doing so, it also unites the key legal and accountancy regulators in England, Wales and Scotland in support of the Scheme through delivery of its nationwide half-day inductions - a collaborative first.

Students attend a Work Insight and Skills week, spending a day at four different businesses and a fifth day at a professional sports club where students learn about the psychology of resilience and goal achievement models, supported by our delivery partner Cleartrack Performance.

In total there are 16 clusters spread across the UK, supporting students from Birmingham, Bradford, Brighton, Bristol, Glasgow, Leeds, London, Manchester, Norwich, Oldham and Reading. In 2019, in line with an ongoing commitment to UK wide growth, the Scheme aims to extend its programme to include students from Blackpool and Northern Ireland. SMBP employs two full time members of staff and is grateful to the 600 plus volunteers within the participating businesses, who deliver content on SMBP days or take responsibility for central functions under the direction of the SMBP team.

This year saw another first, with days being delivered via a 'pop-up' arrangement. Teams from both Selfridges and Coca-Cola travelled from London to deliver their days, hosted by Mills & Reeve, to students in the Norwich cluster.

2018 has also marked the launch of SMBP's bespoke coaching platform. Participating students can draw on the experience of business, legal and finance professionals for advice on writing impactful CVs and personal statements, completing university and job application forms and prepping for an interview. As well as coaching guidance, students can opt to receive information and signposting to employment opportunities and recruitment events at our partner organisations.



SMBP GROWTH TO DATE



Students were invited to complete a post scheme survey, measuring the impact the scheme has had on them across a number of competencies.

When we asked participants a wide range of questions relating to their overall experience of the SMBP programme:

- 80% said that they had a 'Very Good' experience of it
- 95% of participants agreed that they came away with relevant experience that can be included on their CV and talked about in interview
- 94% told us that they have learnt about practical things that they can to do ensure that they reach individual career goals
- 90% agreed that the experience will strengthen their personal statement for university
- 91% understood how a business operates due to the knowledge that was gained from the scheme and
- Across a wide range of skills from an understanding of the legal professions, to building self-confidence, an average of 80% of participants rated themselves as Very Good as a result of SMBP.

In 2018, SMBP launched a cluster in Glasgow. 21 students registered to attend the Scheme.

The Glasgow Induction Day was delivered by the Law Society of Scotland, Student Awards Agency Scotland, the Faculty of Advocates, ACCA, ICAS and the ICAS Foundation. Through the Scheme's partnership with Network Rail, student travel was heavily subsidised by Scot Rail. Students spent their Work Insight & Skills days at: Scottish TV (STV); Network Rail in partnership with Dentons; SSE in partnership with CMS; PWC and Glasgow Warriors. 100% of the students who completed the post scheme survey said they rated the scheme 'very good' and 100% said they would recommend the scheme to others.

ACCA were thrilled to work with SMBP to deliver the first programme in Scotland. The young people who participated were clearly enthused by the activities and excited to learn. The difference that employers can make - with relatively little input - is amazing and the impact dramatic. Proud to have been part of such a great initiative Craig Vickery at ACCA
