AN INTRO FROM **OUR BOARD OF TRUSTEES**



Each year, the SMBP team works with businesses from right across the UK to provide students from low-income backgrounds work insight with multiple employers, resilience training and lifetime career mentoring. It is a true collaboration, with each business taking responsibility for delivering one aspect of a weeklong experience, be it a day in their offices, co-delivering a resilience day or providing volunteers to chaperone students.

This collaborative effort sees students spend a day at four different organisations engaging in business simulation activities and skills workshops. Their fifth day is spent at a professional sports club where students learn about the psychology of resilience and goal achievement models, supported by our sport and business psychology partner Cleartrack Performance. The SMBP alumni are then provided with lifetime access to the SMBP App which includes a career mentoring platform and rolling job opportunity notifications from the 198 businesses which make up the SMBP.

Since its launch, the SMBP has achieved growth year on year in three key areas: growth in the number of students that take part in the Programme, the number of businesses that support its delivery and its geographic reach across the UK. 2023 was no exception. The SMBP welcomed 630 students onto its Programmes, facilitated by 198 businesses and launched its first Devon based Programme in Exeter, led by a volunteer team from Pennon Group. In addition, existing Programmes in Belfast and London were expanded to increase student placements.


2023 also saw the launch of a transatlantic Programme, a US Pilot in Chicago. The success of this pilot has enabled SMBP to scale to a full 12 month Programme in 2024 in partnership with law firms Holland & Knight and Faegre Drinker Biddle & Reath and local charity TA98.

Our focus in 2024 will be to expand our reach to Plymouth, St Austell & Truro, Newport, Derry -Londonderry and Wrexham. creating more opportunities for young students across the UK.



Finally, **QUALITY** is at the forefront of our programme delivery. We pride ourselves on delivering four meaningful encounters across one week, with students engaging in business simulation workshops underpinned be an employability competency framework, rated at the highest level by the Skills Builder Partnership. This is demonstrated by student feedback; 100% of students who take part in the SMBP WISE programme would recommend it to their peers.

PROGRAMME LOCATIONS


In 2023 SMBP and its partners delivered over 656 WISE weeks of student placements across England, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, and the US. We delivered Programmes in 17 towns and cities with local employers, for students living in those towns and cities and the surrounding areas. In addition, we delivered our National Online week in the Easter term break, providing the opportunity for students in more rural areas of the UK to take part in our Programmes.

We were thrilled to launch our Exeter cluster in partnership with Pennon Group. The full details of this can be found in our Case Study. We also expanded our existing Programmes in London and Belfast to increase student placements.

We look forward to expanding further into the South West, Wales and Northern Ireland in 2024. Watch this space!







OUR GROWTH HISTORY

In 2014, the SMBP (previously LSMP), embarked on a journey to reshape the landscape of career opportunities for students from low-income backgrounds in the UK. As we prepare to celebrate our 10th year of empowering students in 2024, it's worth reflecting on the remarkable growth we have experienced over the past decade.

From our humble beginnings in London, where we initially provided opportunities to 20 students, we have burgeoned into a nationwide force for change. Our collaborative efforts, bringing together over 180 commercial organisations, professional services firms, and professional sports teams, have been instrumental in our transformative impact on student lives.

Our unique approach involves fostering partnerships between these entities and students in towns and cities across the UK. By uniting forces, the participating organisations share a common commitment: to support students from low socio-economic backgrounds in their pursuit of meaningful and fulfilling careers.

In just under a decade, we have expanded our reach exponentially. We now offer over 650 student places across the entire United Kingdom as of 2023. This expansion underscores the increasing recognition and endorsement of our mission by a diverse array of stakeholders.

Beyond the numbers, our growth speaks volumes about the efficacy of our collaborative model. The symbiotic relationship between commercial organisations, professional services firms, and professional sports teams, working in tandem with students, has created a dynamic ecosystem that fosters real, tangible opportunities.



PROGRAMME DELIVERY **HIGHLIGHTS**

At the end of each SMBP WISE programme, students are invited to provide feedback by completing a post programme survey measuring their overall experience. After 2023's feedback, we saw that students confirmed the following:



100% of students said they would recommend the SMBP Programme to other students



82% of students rated their SMBP WISE week very good



99% of students said they have a better or firm idea what they would like to do for a job/career



93% are aware of how a business operates & what they are looking for in employees



96% rated their understanding of the different career opportunities available to them within the organisations which hosted sessions good or very good



87% agree the experience will help strengthen their personal statement



91% now rated their self confidence good or very good



STUDENT COMPETENCY **STATISTICS**



As part of students continuous improvement, we have partnered with the Skills Builder Partnership to introduce a Pre and Post skills questionnaire which allows students to benchmark their ability in our key competencies before and after the programme.

Students are given a series of statements and asked how often they did each. Each answer is attributed a numerical score with the lowest frequency earning 1 point and the highest earning 4. This allows us to understand how much students are developing their competencies across the SMBP week. The results for 2023 were as follows:

16% increase in students Communication skills



15% increase in students **Resilience & Goal Planning** skills



16% increase in students **Creativity & Problem Solving** skills


I feel like the week has benefitted me. I visited Cambridge University Press and Assessment, Kettles Yard, Cambridge City Events at Anglia Ruskin University, and Cambridge Junction to learn about a variety of things such as sound and music. We also learnt how to work under pressure and deal with problems surrounding ethics. I have learnt a variety of skills that will benefit me and my CV. I took this a step further by becoming an SMBP Ambassador as I can put these skills to the test and show students what I have learnt and share my experiences.

I applied to the SMBP programme so I could have a valuable and productive experience over the summer. I particularly enjoyed visiting Aviva; it was a really good experience because through another programme I took part in during sixth form, I had previously had the opportunity to visit their office in Sheffield. And to be able to visit their office in York was really interesting opportunity to learn more around the company and its employees. I also enjoyed my visit to Bupa, where they gave us tips on useful techniques for enhancing our presentation skills in front of a large audience.

My overall experience was beneficial and positive as it helped me with reissuing my decision of pursuing a legal career and becoming an immigration solicitor, mainly focusing on international immigration. I thought that it was a great experience. I found that it was really useful to actually learn what employers expected from young people going to into the world of work. It was really interesting to find out exactly what employers look for when they are recruiting people into their organisations. The most useful session was on interview techniques, where I learned how important it is to know what to say during an interview. It was a great opportunity to visit different companies and see where people work. For example, at PwC, we had a full guided tour of the facilities and offices and therefore we could really experience life in that company. It was also really useful to hear the background that people come from and their pathways into what they are doing now. Overall, it was an excellent experience.

At Oldham College we have an improvement partner, who at multiple points of the year, conducts are series of deep dive quality checks that replicate the Ofsted process. They had chosen to deep dive our Level 3 Business groups. They fed back that learners have access to a very good range of initiatives which promote social mobility and career aspiration which they spoke knowledgably about. These initiatives include opportunities with SMBP, which learners value highly. This scheme offers work insight and access to a range of other support such as mentoring and internships which learners say helps with their course and their future. Learners who are first generation going to university can apply for the SMBP programme which includes placement, access to networks and an opportunity for degree apprenticeships.

This experience is well planned. Learners talk about how this has improved their confidence, helped them develop networks with new people, and given them a good understanding of how the workplace operates. They feel this work experience has prepared them well for the future.

CASE STUDY: SMBP EXETER

Pennon Group (made up of Bournemouth, Bristol and South West Water) started its SMBP journey when Barry Mathews joined the company in 2023. Barry's enthusiasm for SMBP as one of its founders quickly rubbed off on the team and later that year, we welcomed the first SMBP cluster to Devon.

The Exeter cluster was formed in only a few months with the invaluable support of the SMBP team. We sourced students with the help of the University of Exeter and went into local schools to engage students and teachers. Five other fantastic businesses joined South West Water on delivering the SMBP Exeter week providing a variety of different commercial settings - Ashfords Solicitors supporting Exeter Chiefs on the resilience day, Princess Yachts, University of Exeter and Foot Anstey Solicitors.

During the week, the students engaged fully and impressed all of the partner businesses with how they threw themselves straight into any

tasks set. The students were given real life problems to solve including drought resilience, sustainability, and legal work. They tackled these scenarios head on through negotiations, business proposals and speed networking whilst developing key business skills from resilience to commerciality. As a chaperone, it was rewarding to watch the students grow in confidence throughout the week and thrive in a business

Pennon is proud to continue its SMBP journey by facilitating additional SMBP clusters across our whole patch in the south west, including the first cluster coming to Cornwall in 2024! It is a privilege to play a part in shaping these students lives and provide work experience opportunities to low-income students who may not otherwise have had the confidence to experience the corporate world.

CASE STUDY: SMBP CHICAGO

SMBP's ambition was to launch a pilot event in the US to understand how the delivery model translated and if there was an appetite for a full Work Insight and Skills Experience (WISE) programme.

Initial interest from law firms, Holland & Knight and Faegre Drinker Biddle & Reath, gave us the starting blocks to establish in Chicago. Through the law firms, we connected with two local charities who would support in recruiting students to attend the pilot: The NHP Foundation and TA98.

The pilot was delivered across three consecutive days, with Faegre Drinker Biddle & Reath and Holland & Knight each delivering a day in their offices. The third day was the Resilience and Goal Planning Day, a staple of all SMBP Programmes. This was delivered by SMBP's Founder, Barry Matthews and author of the resilience content and founder of Cleartrack Performance, Mark Soden. The day at Holland and Knight involved sessions being delivered by multiple clients from a variety of industries to provide students with an insight into multiple career options. The day at Faegre Drinker Biddle & Reath gave insights into what it's like to work in a law firm, both as a lawyer and non-lawyer.

It is hard to know Barry Matthews without knowing about his passion for SMBP and its mission. 

SQUIRE PATTON BOGGS BURSARY

SMBP were thrilled to work with Squire Patton Boggs' to launch its Access to Law Scholarship Programme in the UK, an initiative to provide financial assistance to students from less advantaged backgrounds seeking a career in law. The Programme is part of the firm's wider social mobility efforts which have seen it rank in the top 10 employers in the Social Mobility Employer Index. The three-year Programme will support seven Year 13 SMBP alumni, covering their university tuition fees and providing an annual bursary of £2,500 for cost of living expenses. The Programme also includes mentoring, work experience at one of the firm's UK offices and the opportunity to join its summer vacation scheme to secure a training contract. Partner Rob Elvin, who leads the firm's Social Mobility Resource Group, commented: "Ability is not the preserve of the privileged. The cost-of-living crisis has made it even harder for young people from diverse and less advantaged backgrounds to be able to go to university, gain further qualifications and achieve the careers they deserve." "We've met so many talented people through our work with the SMBP and, with their help, we have been able to launch this Programme to provide focused support to seven students with great potential who we look forward to supporting on their journey through university and in their future career."

Receiving the Squire Patton Boggs SMBP Bursary has significantly shaped my academic journey. The invaluable combination of mentoring and financial support has been crucial in allowing me to concentrate on my studies and continue pursuing my passion for law.

I was speaking with a woman who gave me an interview, I was lucky enough to get through to the next stage and, in September I started my new role at Aviva.


If it was not for attending the SMBP week, I would not be where I am today. University is not always the way forward and if that is not for you, that is ok. There are so many options, and you are not limited.

Before I completed the London SMBP programme in 2017, becoming a lawyer felt like an almost impossible challenge. I applied for the programme on the off chance that I would gain a place which, looking back, was the best choice I could have made as a 16-yearold. The professional skills and experiences I gained through the programme still form the basis of how I present myself in interviews, which has proved invaluable and given me the confidence I needed to pursue a career in the profession. I luckily secured a role as an in-house trainee solicitor at Pennon Group earlier this year, training through the new apprenticeship route and completing the SQE in early 2025. Training in-house has been an incredible experience thus far and has particularly helped in developing my understanding of the law in a commercial setting. I was given the opportunity to support with the launch and delivery of the SMBP in the South West, which was a very surreal full-circle moment for me. It's important to me that those who want to pursue a career in the law profession feel as confident in their goals as I do now – which wouldn't have happened without the SMBP!

VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES

Deliver a SMBP WISE Day

SMBP are looking for businesses based across the UK to deliver a Work Insight & Skills Experience (WISE) day and provide lunch for a group of 20-25 students during the summer holidays. The day should give students an overview of your company, an understanding of the employment opportunities with a focus on apprenticeships and grad schemes and provide students with an opportunity to develop their key competencies during interactive business games.

SMBP will work with local education contacts to recruit bright and engaged eligible students and oversee the student registration process including guardian consent and management of any student requirements. A Volunteer Cluster Co-ordinator will organise monthly meetings to ensure partners are on course to deliver their day, provide guidance on how a Work Insight and Skills day should be structured and delivered in line with SMBP's Safeguarding Policy. SMBP will also organise and pay for student travel from their home to each venue, and provide students with access to the SMBP App to assist with the coordination and delivery of your day.

Online Career Mentoring for SMBP Alumni

Following each SMBP WISE week, students are granted lifetime access to the SMBP Career Mentoring Platform. SMBP Alumni can access mentors throughout their career to provide support relating to CV or personal statements, and end to end support with applications for jobs or promotions.

SMBP has created a bespoke group mentoring structure based on the retail banking secure messaging model. Our mentors are alerted by email when alumni questions are asked. This allows our volunteer mentors to pick up queries they feel they are best placed to answer and only when they have the capacity to do so.

Partners provide volunteers from within their organisation to assist students with career advice when they have the capacity to do so.

SMBP provides: compulsory safeguarding training to all volunteers; a secure online platform for volunteers to communicate with students in a safe and professional space; a flexible volunteering opportunity which fits around employee time and commitments; and access to the SMBP Career Mentoring Guide, authored by senior HR Leads from the SMBP participating partner businesses. Finally, companies can access an annual report summarising volunteer activity for their own impact reporting.


SMBP's Talent Pipeline

In return, SMBP provides a branded section within the SMBP app to raise students' awareness of the sponsoring business and its career opportunities. Sponsor a Local Resilience and **Goal Planning Day**

The Resilience and Goal Planning Day is at the heart of the SMBP Work Insight & Skills Experience (WISE) week. It is delivered to all students attending a weeklong Programmes, across the UK at professional sports club (including Manchester United, Arsenal and Leicester City). During the day students learn about the psychology of resilience, how to deal with setbacks and goal achievement models.

The SMBP Resilience Programme has been authored by an Olympic level sports performance expert (Cleartrack Performance), a senior FTSE100 executive and validated by a child psychologist.

Sponsors make a donation towards the catering and venue hire costs; provide volunteers to attend a Train the Trainer event in London with Cleartrack Performance; and assist with delivery at a local Resilience and Goal Planning Day.

SMBP provides annual resilience training for volunteers including: access to the SMBP Resilience Trainer Handbook; access to the existing network of experienced Delivery Leads to provide peer support; and an opportunity for volunteers to visit and engage with elite sports clubs across the UK. This is a unique and inspirational initiative for employers seeking development opportunities for their own employees.
